

The SEWPCA 2011 WPCS bronze medal show took place on the 19<sup>th</sup> June, at Great Bookham Eq. Centre. Surrey on what proved to be the driest day of the whole week! With over 200 pre-entered ponies at this event, this was never going to be a small affair.

Dr Wynne Davies and his son David of the Ceulan stud came down to judge our Welsh Section B and Part/breds and our Welsh Section A's respectfully. Never before has such a large A entry been judged so swiftly, finishing well before the Welsh Section D's this year. David Davies found his Section A youngstock champion in The Lee Bros show team's Cascob Little Sprite which came from the two year old filly class and reserve going to Blanche Goldleaf owned by Vanessa Mardon from the two year old colt class. The Overall Welsh Section A Bronze Medal champion was found in Friars Tia owned by Salcey-Derw stud who won the Barren mare class and reserve slot going to the Stallion class winner, Friars Golden Mark belonging to Mrs Tara Coppins and shown by Liesel Burt.

Dr Wynne Davies found his Section B youngstock champion in Dennis and Julie Hounsham's Moelview Prince Consort with reserve going to the Section B foal class winner, Longlaves Lollapaloosa owned by Mrs J Filmer. The Section B WPCS Bronze medal champion was found in Mrs Jo Filmers stallion class winner, Lemonshill Falcon, with this time reserve being awarded to Mr & Mrs J Greenleaf's Brookhall Porcelain. Dr Wynne went on to judge our Part bred Welsh classes where he found the youngstock champion in Nick Snelling's Tambrook Super Star with reserve going to the foal class winner, Taylor Teatime. The Welsh Part Bred Bronze medal was won by Nick Snelling's 4 yr old and over class winner, Hendraws Gwen, with reserve this time being awarded to the youngstock champion Tambrook Super Star.

Mr. A. G. Roberts found his Section C youngstock champion in the Yearling Filly class winner, Bookhamlodge Polly Poppit owned by Miss Ellie Bath, with reserve going to the 3 yr old class winner, Fencers Sweet Caroline owned by Julie Cumming and Robert Ireland. He went on to award his WPCS bronze medal to the youngstock champion, Bookhamlodge Polly Poppit with the reserve this time being awarded to Maesllwch Menna, winner of the Barren Mare class for the Lee bros show team.

Mr. D. W. Roberts found his Section D youngstock champion in Thorneyside the High Flyer who won the 2 yr old class for Mr P.J. Gray and shown by Mr G. P. Mitchell. The reserve slot being awarded to the 3yr old class winner, Elmway Charlie Cool owned by James Scammell. Mr Roberts then went on to award the Brood Mare class winner, Danaway Cracklin Rose, owned by Mr Matty Attrell, the WPCS Bronze medal for the Section D's, with reserve going to the youngstock champion, Thorneyside the High Flyer.

Our Supreme championships were judged by all four of our Welsh judges, and they found the following results. Supreme Gelding. Forlan Neptune, Section A. Reserve going to Giffos Tan Du from the Section C's. Supreme Foal was won Springbourne Clarice from the Section A foal class with reserve going to the Section C foal, Crivarda The Prodigy. Supreme Brood Mare went to Danaway Cracklin Rose from the Section D's and reserve to the section A's, Springbourne Clarinda. Supreme stallion of the show was the Section A class winner, Friars Golden Mark, with the reserve slot this time going to the Welsh Section B stallion, Lemonshill Falcon. Supreme Barren Mare Went to Friars Tia from the Section A Barren mare class, with the Section C class winner, Maesllwch

Menna taking reserve. The four judges found the Welsh youngstock champion in the Section C medal winner, and yearling filly class winner, Bookhamlodge Polly Poppit with reserve being awarded to the Section A two year old filly class winner, Cascob Little Sprite.

The last and final supreme championship judged by our four judges, for overall Supreme Inhand champion of the show, was awarded to Mr Matty Attrell's Section D Brood Mare, Danaway Cracklin Rose with reserve slot being awarded to the Section A Barren Mare medal winner, Friars Tia.

Our novice ridden champion was found by judge, Mr Peter Deacon, in Bookham Lodge Tony Montanna, owned and ridden by Jane Gregory from the Welsh Section C class. Reserve was found in Section D class winner, Ddraiggoch Brenin Solomon. Mr Deacon went on judging all day, and found his inhand champion of the mixed classes, all carrying Equifest qualifications, in the Welsh Section B stallion, Priestwood Taliesin, with the reserve going to another Section B stallion, Erimus Pilkington.

Our open ridden mini champion was found by Mr Phil Pugh, who judged these classes for us in, Mrs Debbie Barr's Waitwith Juliet ridden by Lucy Breach who was also awarded the WPCS performance medal. The reserve position going to Telaid Addod owned by Zoe Buttery and ridden by Chloe Buttery.

Mr Pugh went on to judge all our open ridden classes and found his champion and WPCS performance medal winner in the Section C class winner, Sauvey Golden Condor, owned by Mrs Debbie Barr and ridden by Alice Barr. The reserve went to Miss Samantha Roberts riding John and Maggie Carter's Millcroft Ghost.

Our two inhand judges, Mr A.G and Mr D.W. Roberts then continued judging our driven classes for us, with 12 exhibits coming forward. Mr Stevie Watts of the Trixies stud captured the covered Welsh Driven champion who also gained a WPCS Performance medal, with Trixies She's a Goodan. Our driving events again this year were organised for us by Miss Amelia Wenham of the Montel stud.
